Whereas, Dartmouth College, as stated in its' mission statement, seeks to provide an "undergraduate, graduate, and professional education of the highest quality," and

Whereas, Dartmouth College is the only Ivy League institution not to have integrated into its curriculum a Korean Studies program, and

Whereas, students and student groups have been working at Dartmouth College since 1989 to create such a program, and

Whereas the Asian and Middle Eastern Studies Program is currently considering recommending a permanent position in Korean Studies, and

Whereas in the last year many students have expressed both the desire and need for a Korean Studies Program.

Let it be resolved that the Student Assembly believes that a Korean Studies Program would be a great Academic addition and would help t further the aims of the college.

Let it be further resolved, that the Student Assembly supports a permanent appointment in the area of Korean Studies.

And let it be finally resolved, that the Student Assembly asks the College to work to create a Korean Studies Program.
