AFTER ACTION REPORT

Operation Uniontown III - Boxsprings: 10 February 1968 to 28 March 1968

1. During the period 10 February 1968 to 28 March 1968 F Company Operated in AOs South Uniontown, Columbus, North Uniontown, Upshur, and Harrisburg under the operational control of the 199th Inf Bde (Lt)(Sep). The concept of employment was for both light recon teams and heavy combat-recon teams to monitor trails and suspected river crossing sites. POWs were an additional mission of combat-recon teams. When it was possible to fix the enemy, reaction forces were committed to exploit the situation. The Operation was highly successful. The following is a statistical summary of activities:
