Over 500 students, professionals, and community activists will participate in this year's tenth anniversary conference hosted by Cornell. Entitled "Ten Years of ECASU: Momentum for Change", this year's conference will celebrate the struggles of Asian Americans, summarize ECASU's achievements over its first decade, and examine issues facing Asian Americans today to formulate concrete strategies for the future. Confirmed speakers include Fred Houn, founding member of ECASU and member of the Asian American Jazz Ensemble; Elizabeth Young, a longtime activist in NY and an associate of Interchange Consultants; Tisa Chang, founder and associate of the Pan Asian Repertory Theatre in NY; Ron Takaki, professor at UC Berkeley's Department of Ethnic Studies. Christine Choy and Renee Tajima will present their film "Who Killed Vincent Chin?" at the conference.
